Brother's Corner

In college, I had the pleasure of taking a philosophy course titled the Functions of Philosophy in Theology. The course was taught by one Msgr. Robert Sokolowski. It was my favorite course at the Catholic University of America. Msgr. Sokolowski walked us through an "examination of the Christian understanding of God... he demonstrated how the Christian concept of God preserves both the integrity of reason and the distinctiveness of faith." His book titled "The God of Faith and Reason" came out of the course. One of the things that I will always remember from the course was an examination of the Roman Canon. In the Eucharist prayer, the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts (known as the *epiclesis*) "so that [the bread and wine] may become the Body and Blood of Christ." In the Institution of the Eucharist, Christ takes and blesses the bread and the wine separately. "While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body...then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me." The priest will say the words of institution and, according to St. Ambrose to which the Church will affirm, the offerings become the Body and Blood of Christ once the words of institution have been said. But there is a significance in the distinct blessing of the bread and the wine. They remain separate species. This denotes Christ's death. The body cannot survive without blood. Jesus is foreshadowing His own death at the Last Supper. When we hear and adore the Body and Blood of Christ during the Eucharistic prayer, we remember the sacrifice of the Cross. After the Doxology and the recitation of the Lord's Prayer, we recite "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us...Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us...Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, Grant us peace." During the *Agnus Dei*, the priest breaks off a piece of the host and places it into the chalice. The Body and Blood come together. Think resurrection. When we receive Jesus in the Eucharist, we receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of the incarnate Jesus Christ who conquered sin and death at the moment of His death and resurrection. When we approach the Eucharist in adoration with the infused virtues of faith, hope and charity, we can authentically adore Christ as the centurion did at the foot of the cross and say, "Truly this man was [and is] the Son of God." (Matt 27:54).

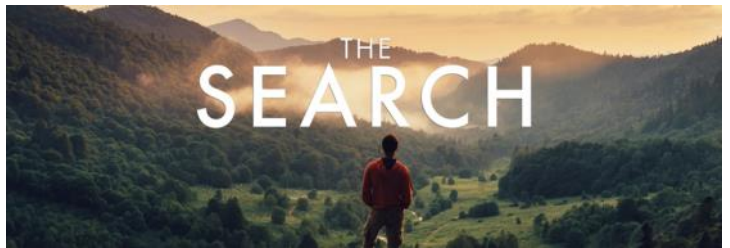

BEGINNING THIS WEEKEND!

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled in June. Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of Sundays beginning March 27, 2022, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m. via video-conferencing on Zoom.

Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate certified within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.

Joshua 5:9a, 10-12

A reading from the Book of Joshua:

The LORD said to Joshua, "Today I have removed the reproach of Egypt from you." While the Israelites were encamped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho, they celebrated the Passover on the evening of the fourteenth of the month. On the day after the Passover, they ate of the produce of the land in the form of unleavened cakes and parched grain. Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke:

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers."' So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was

dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found."
