### **Pastor's Corner**

Thoughts on penitence

This week we began Lent. I offer the following thoughts, from St. Pope Paul VI's Apostolic Constitution, *Paenitemini*, of February 17, 1966, to expand our understanding of penance. It has always been a central part of Christian life because it was a central part of Jesus' life. We need to regain this sense, lost over the last century, to help free us from our self-centeredness and pride. -Fr. Carl, OP

"The Church...has noted with joy that almost everywhere and at all times penitence has held a place of great importance, since it is closely linked with the intimate sense of religion which pervades the life of most ancient peoples as well as with the more advanced expressions of the great religions connected with the progress of culture."

"The kingdom of God announced by Christ can be entered only by a "change of heart" ("metanoia") that is to say through that intimate and total change and renewal of the entire man—of all his opinions, judgments and decisions—which takes place in him in the light of the sanctity and charity of God, the sanctity and charity which were manifested to us in the Son and communicated fully.

"The invitation of the Son to "metanoia" becomes all the more inescapable inasmuch as He not only preaches it but Himself offers an example. Christ, in fact, is the supreme model for those doing penance. He willed to suffer punishment for sins which were not His but those of others."

"Therefore the Church—while it reaffirms the primacy of the religious and supernatural values of penitence (values extremely suitable for restoring to the world today a sense of the presence of God and of His sovereignty over man and a sense of Christ and His salvation)—invites everyone to accompany the inner conversion of the spirit with the voluntary exercise of external acts of penitence:

"A — It insists first of all that the virtue of penitence be exercised in persevering faithfulness to the duties of one's state in life, in the acceptance of the difficulties arising from one's work and from human coexistence, in a patient bearing of the trials of earthly life and of the utter insecurity which pervades it

"B — Those members of the Church who are stricken by infirmities, illnesses, poverty or misfortunes, or who are persecuted for the love of justice, are invited to unite their sorrows to the suffering of Christ in such a way that they not only satisfy more thoroughly the precept of penitence but also obtain for the brethren a life of grace and for themselves that beatitude which is promised in the Gospel to those who suffer."

"...Holy Mother Church, although it has always observed in a special way abstinence from meat and fasting, nevertheless wants to indicate in the traditional triad of "prayer—fasting—charity" the fundamental means of complying with the divine precepts of penitence."



Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who have received religious instruction but for various reasons were never confirmed.

The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled in June. Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing a minimum of 8 sessions held over a series of Sundays beginning March 27, 2022, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m. via video-conferencing on Zoom.

Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate certified within the past 6 months, and have a Confirmation sponsor who must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic and at least 16 years of age.

### 40 DAYS OF RENEWAL

LENT IS A SEASON IN WHICH THE FAITHFUL ARE CALLED TO REFLECT ON THE PASCHAL MYSTERY IN A PARTICULARLY FOCUSED WAY. IT IS A TIME OF SPIRITUAL RENEWAL AND TO CAREFULLY EXAMINE ONE'S RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD AND OTHERS. IT IS ALSO A TIME IN WHICH CATECHUMENS PREPARE TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION AT THE EASTER VIGIL. THE CHURCH CALLS EVERYONE, THEREFORE, TO A SPIRIT OF PENANCE THROUGH THE TRADITIONAL LENTEN PRACTICES OF PRAYING, FASTING, AND ALMSGIVING.

**LENT AND EASTER:** "Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ." (usccb.org)

The faithful are encouraged to participate in special devotions such as Eucharistic adoration, the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and praying for the vocations of priesthood and religious life are also encouraged. Lent is a privileged time for celebrating the Sacrament of Penance (Confession). The faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

Fasting and abstinence fosters a spirit of repentance and unites us more closely to Christ. All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. Fasting is understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two smaller meals may be eaten, but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted unless a health or an ability to work would seriously be affected.

From the earliest times giving to the poor, or almsgiving, has been an invaluable spiritual practice. Catholics are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church. The faithful are also urged to give of their time to others. Consider calling the aged, sick, homebound or those in prison. Remember the words of Jesus, "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40)

As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2462).


