Brother's Corner

FATHERHOOD MATTERS

In our culture, the role of the father as head of the family has diminished in the last 50 years. Due to the growing secularization of society, the need for both parents to earn an income to maintain a basic standard of living, and the ethos of "toxic masculinity" that deters men from desiring to be faithful husbands and fathers has left the next generation of Christians in a crisis. The witness of faithful husbands and fathers has also diminished due to the growing divorce rate and the growing number of children living without a father in the household (roughly 19,700,000 according to the US Census Bureau). Those fathers who are present speak volumes by their actions (or failure to act) with regard to their faith. "According to data collected by Promise Keepers and Baptist Press, if a father does not go to church, even if his wife does, only 1 child in 50 will become a regular worshiper...If a father does go regularly, regardless of what the mother does, between two-thirds and three-quarters of their children will attend church as adults." Pope John Paul II noted,

"In revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God, a man is called upon to ensure the harmonious and united development of all the members of the family."

Now more than ever children need men in their lives who exemplify a virtuous, Christ-oriented life. But we can't expect a generation of men to change overnight. Conversion, the change of hearts, minds, and souls to Christ takes time. In order to develop a relationship with Christ, a few things are necessary: Pray every day, examine your conscience before going to bed, Go to Mass with your family, read the readings before coming to Mass with your kids, and dedicate the Sabbath as a day of rest and true recreation. Strive to go to confession once a month. Build fraternity with other Catholic men. Bishop Thomas Olmstead in his letter to Catholic men titled "Into the Breach" notes that "Catholic friendship among men has a dramatic impact on their faith lives. Men who have bonds of brotherhood with other Catholic men pray more, go to Mass and Confession more frequently, read the Scriptures more often, and are more active in the faith." With all this in mind, I invite young men and fathers with young kids to spend one hour a week with other men and fathers for an early morning holy hour from 5:00 to 6:00 a.m. each Thursday in the Church. Because it is a new initiative from the parish, this holy hour will be offered on April 28 and all the Thursdays in the month of May and then be revisited from there. Afterward, we plan to go to RRAGS for some breakfast and fellowship. If 5 am is a difficult time, maybe come once and meet other young men and dads and begin to develop friendships among fellow Catholic men in the parish. I'll conclude with this, in order for an authentic renewal of Christ-like masculinity to occur in our families, parishes, and society, "each Catholic man must be prepared to give himself completely, to charge into the breach, to engage in spiritual combat, to defend women, children, and others against the wickedness and snares of the devil!" Fatherhood Matters.
