Pastor's Corner

Birthdays and Anniversaries

As you probably know by now, I left for two weeks of vacation on May 31; I will be in Italy with a number of friars until June 15, then I will be home but in mandatory quarantine until the 19th. Finally, we will leave for our Province Assembly on Monday, June 20. Mike Scafani will do a "Soon-to-be Deacon's Corner" on Father's Day, June 19. For these two weeks, I thought I would do a bit more biographical pieces, since I haven't done anything like that since I arrived in July 2019.

May and June are big months in my family. My maternal grandmother (whom I called Nana) ended up sharing her birthday with her son, my mother's twin brother: he was ordained to the priesthood on her 67th birthday in 1970. I thought the first ordination I ever attended was in the summer of 1990, a few months before I entered the Novitiate. It occurred to me a few months ago that is incorrect: my first was my uncle's, 20 years prior, when I was about 7 months along in my mom's womb! I was born just over three weeks after my uncle's ordination. Although I was his first Baptism, it wasn't until August because I was a month premature and spent that month in the neonatal intensive care unit. (Times change: I did my first Baptism as a transitional deacon; I was a "pro" at them by the time I became a priest.) My mother and uncle's birthday is June 21; they turned 36 shortly after my uncle was ordained and I was born.

My own anniversary of ordination is May 29. It's hard to believe, but this year was my 24th anniversary. (My classmate, Fr. Bartholomew Hutcherson, who has helped us out a couple times, celebrated his 25th anniversary on May 31. He was ordained ahead of the rest of us because he got ahead of us in studies.) I look forward to celebrating my silver jubilee next year! I even get some extra time off. The year my classmates and I were ordained (1998), May 29 was the Friday before Pentecost. We were ordained on a Friday because there were 5 of us and we needed the whole weekend for first Masses; they were all over the Bay Area! For that reason, the solemnity of Pentecost has always had a special place in my heart. I am sorry that I will not be able to celebrate it with you this year.

In a bit of coincidence, Bp. John Cummins, Bishop Emeritus of Oakland, who ordained me to the priesthood, also Confirmed me. And speaking of Bp. Cummins: I attended my first Chrism Mass – the Mass where the bishop blesses the three Holy Oils – with him. I had a moment – I cried –when the Sacred Chrism was being blessed realizing that *my* hands were going to be anointed with *that* Chrism in about 2 months!

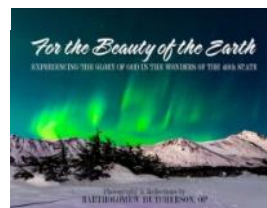

Consequently, brothers and sisters, we are not debtors to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.
