Brother's Corner

Why was it useful to us that Jesus ascended into heaven?

We take many things for granted when discussing the life of Christ as it appears to us in Scripture. We tend not to ask why it was necessary for Christ to ascend into heaven. Why did he need to send the Holy Spirit after his Ascension? For St. Thomas, the Ascension of Christ was and is useful to us. He explains that the Ascension: 1) increases our faith 2) uplifts our hope and 3) directs our fervor of charity to God himself and to heavenly things. First, it increases our faith. Jesus promises the Holy Spirit will come and convince the world of justice for those who believe, for "blessed are they who see not and yet believe." It is indeed right and just that because of our faith in God, that gift that is freely given to us, our faith will be increased and rewarded. Secondly, the Ascension uplifts our hope. Christ does not ascend to heaven to leave us to our own devices. Jesus ascends in order to prepare a place for us in heaven. At the second coming, Christ will come again and will take us into himself so that where He is we may also be. In the act of ascending into heaven. Christ places human nature in heaven. Heaven is now open to humanity. We are given hope of residing there. It is foreshadowed in the prophet Micah that Christ the King shall go through, or He shall open up the way before the remnant of Israel, God's chosen people (Mich 2:12-13). Finally, the Ascension is useful in directing the fervor of our charity to heavenly things. Saint Paul tells us to "seek the things that are above where Christ is sitting at the right hand of God." (Col 3:1) It serves as a reminder to have in our mind the things that pertain to God, not solely the things that are upon the earth. In order to live a virtuous life in accordance with our reason and live according to the Beatitudes, we need to remember where we truly belong, where our happiness will be fulfilled. As pilgrim people, as parishioners, we belong in heaven. The heavenly Jerusalem is our proper home. St. Dominic's in Benicia is our pit-stop/ service station on our way to the beatific vision. We gather as a community of believers and believe that the reason we exist is to know and to love God, to know the Trinity in its unity. We experience a foretaste of that at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in the proclamation of the Word and reception of the Eucharist. Let's continue on the pilgrimage together. We'll see each other in the Eucharist.

Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews:

Christ did not enter into a sanctuary made by hands, a copy of the true one, but heaven itself, that he might now appear before God on our behalf. Not that he might offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters each year into the sanctuary with blood that is not his own; if that were so, he would have had to suffer repeatedly from the foundation of the world. But now once for all he has appeared at the end of the ages to take away sin by his sacrifice. Just as it is appointed that men and women die once, and after this the judgment, so also Christ, offered once to take away the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to take away sin but to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him. Therefore, brothers and sisters, since through the blood of Jesus we have confidence of entrance into the sanctuary by the new and living way he opened for us through the veil, that is, his flesh, and since we have "a great priest over the house of God," let us approach with a sincere heart and in absolute trust, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water. Let us hold unwaveringly to our confession that gives us hope, for he who made the promise is trustworthy. The word of the Lord.
