Pastor's Corner

Rogation Days

Bishop Soto is inviting the faithful of the Diocese of Sacramento to celebrate the ancient tradition of Rogation Days this May, specifically, May 23-25. Prayers, fasting, and abstinence are encouraged for these days. It is a good time to reflect on the themes of integral ecology, environmental justice, and the care for our common home, as called for in the encyclical of Pope Francis, *Laudato Si*.

Rogation days are an ancient practice of prayer and fasting to beg God's mercy for humanity's many transgressions, for protection from calamities, and for a good and bountiful harvest. Here in California, the latter two are very closely related in our extended time of drought. Bishop Soto has chosen the second (of two) series of days, those immediately prior to the celebration of the Ascension, to invite us to observe this year.

The Diocese's Office of Catholic Charities and Social Concerns says these days are for "imploping God's mercy for more rain to bring an end to the drought in California, to bless the precious earth that nourishes us, and protect our forests and mountain communities during the coming months from the risks of wildfires..."

"St. Isidore is recognized as the patron of farmers due to his faithful attendance at daily Mass before going out to labor in the fields. This year the Feast of St. Isidore the Farmer, May 15th, falls on a Sunday. Prayers asking the intercession of St. Isidore may be included during the Sunday liturgies and during the Rogation Days... One of the prayers that the bishop's office suggests for inclusion in the prayer of the faithful either on Sunday and/or within the Rogation Days is "Prayers for contrition and the acknowledgement of our role [in causing the ecological crisis] as the stewards of the creation God has entrusted to us" This is particularly pertinent in light of the leaked memo from the Supreme Court about the possible overturning of *Roe v. Wade*. The striking down of this decision, and subsequent decisions based upon it, will not instantly turn the United States into a prolife nation. Our "national discourse" around unborn life (and the closely related issues of race and poverty), highlighted again in the response to the leak, clearly shows many deeply imbedded, sinful attitudes that we need to do penance for and work as ambassadors of Christ to reshape. By God's grace and our cooperation with it, we can reshape our nation into one that fully appreciates and honors each and every human life.

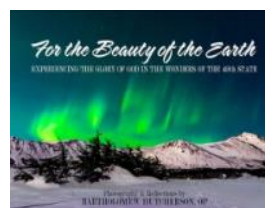

Acts of the Apostles 13:14, 43-52

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God. On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord. All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region. The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.
