Pastor's Corner

The Darker Side of June

Last week, I shared with you some big family dates in May and June, including Nana's birthday, my uncle's ordination to the priesthood, my birthday, my mom and uncle's birthday, and my ordination to the priesthood, all within a 5-week span between May 15 and June 21.

It is also a heavy time for me. The anniversary of my father's death is June 20, 1999 (a day before my mother and uncle's birthday), which was also Father's Day that year. My father had ALS, or Lou Gehrig's Disease, for over a decade. It was a nuisance for most of that time; he only became debilitated the last few years of his life. He was diagnosed at 55, about 3 months after his own father died of the same disease. (Ironically, my two grandfathers died four days apart from each other in my senior year of high school.)

There are two amazing, grace-filling things about my father's illness. The first is that that he lived to see me ordained at all, much less my first anniversary! ALS' progression is anything but predictable: it strikes everyone differently both in effects and scale of time. (I had a high school classmate who died of ALS shortly before Christmas; he had the disease about 5 years. My paternal grandfather died 18 months after he was diagnosed.) There were periods of deterioration when we thought, "Well, that's it!" but it wasn't. He didn't rally, but he would simply stop getting worse for a time. My father was fortunate in that he died before he was completely bed-ridden and unable to speak or eat.

As I've told you, my parents divorced when I was eight. I lived with my mom, but I had regular visits with my dad on weekends, school breaks, summertime, etc. My dad was always very protective of his time with me; it never felt like enough to him. In my first year of priesthood, my mother was diagnosed with cancer. I was assigned to St. Dominic's in Eagle Rock (Los Angeles). All of a sudden, I had no idea how I, an only child, was going to manage two sick parents, each living in a different place and me living in a third. In the midst of those chaotic days, my father had his finest, most heroic moment: the second amazing moment. Shortly after learning of mom's diagnosis, he took my hand in his, looked me straight in the eye (two things he never did!), and said, "Son, take care of your mother. Don't worry about me." In that moment, I felt the enormity of the sacrifice those few words encompassed: the time he spent with me, one of the things he treasured most in his life, so I would be free to care for his wife of 22 years and his ex-wife of 21 years. I was stunned and amazed and I was never prouder of my father than that moment. The happy irony was that because of my mom's illness, I was able to visit with my dad a lot in what turned out to be the last months of his life.

<u>Local Pilgrimage in Honor</u> <u>of Our Eucharistic Lord</u>

Pilgrims are welcome to join for a single leg or for the entire pilgrimage:

• 8:15 am Mass at St. Dominic's and Blessing of Pilgrims.

• Walk from St. Dominic's to St. Catherine of Siena (7 miles): Pilgrims leave St. Dominic's immediately following Mass

• From St. Catherine of Siena --> St. Basil the Great (2 miles): Pilgrims leave St. Catherine's around 1:30 pm

• From St. Basil the Great --> St. Vincent Ferrer (1.5 miles): Pilgrims leave St. Basil's around 4:00 pm

Arrive at St. Vincent Ferrer at 5:00 pm for Mass
