Among my five siblings I'm the second oldest, and I grew up in a traditional Catholic family. Both my mom and dad enthusiastically claimed and practiced their faith. I have always been intrigued by the mystery of faith, and have held my Catholic beliefs and traditions dearly in my heart. I remember my parent's fondness for a number of priests we knew, and growing up with priests who were close family friends was a wonderful blessing.

As a boy I was encouraged to consider the priesthood, which I remember thinking about as late as my pre or early teens, but that thought seemed to never last more than a few minutes at a time. Perhaps because of the incredible witness of joyful and sacrificial love I saw in my parent's relationship, and in how they loved us, from a young age I saw my future as a married man. I loved my dad more than anything or anyone in the world, and I wanted to be a dad too. I also recall being fixated at Mass on elderly couples as they processed up the center isle together to receive communion, and I wondered how my parents would look together when they reached that age. Sadly (a story for another time), my father would never grow old. There was something simply fascinating to me about man and wife, two typically young people grafted together as one in marriage, each promising to love and care for each other throughout the rest of their days.

Well before Sandy and I were married, anticipating being married to each other one day, we talked about having children and how we would love and raise them. I am forever grateful to our good Lord that he blessed us with our three children. Within an hour or two after our first child was born, standing back watching the nurse give him his first bath, I was overwhelmed by a glow and a warmth that felt like God's embrace, and I recall feelings of great love, humility, and incredible blessing that God had entrusted to me the opportunity to participate in the miracle of life. His great blessing of mystery, love, and bestowal of trust happened two more times with our beautiful daughters.

I venture to suppose that like we did, most young parents have an idyllic vision of what parenting and child rearing to adulthood is going to look like. Thankfully, God blessed me with the great partner He did, and together we faced a few unanticipated challenges which have made us wiser, stronger, and even more faithful. On this Father's Day weekend, we pray with all the dads out there, as well as God-

fathers, step-fathers, and others serving as fatherly figures, that you have a blessed moment to revel in joy and mystery of fatherhood, and that you continue to grow in the selfless outpouring of the love entrusted to you by our Father in heaven.
