### **Pastor's Corner**

My post-vacation COVID journey: Pride goes before the fall

First, let me say that I had a wonderful vacation. Just about everything about it was over the top. My companions (two older Dominicans and one younger, and one blood-sister) were fun, adventurous, flexible, and a delight to be with. I finally got to Siena and to pray before the remains of St. Catherine in the Basilica of St. Dominic and visit St. Catherine's home. I got to pray with another illustrious Dominican saint, St. Agnes of Montepulciano, in her sanctuary. We visited Orvieto, where St. Thomas Aguinas composed the Mass and Liturgy of the Hours' prayers for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. And because it's Italy, and because we are Dominicans, there was lots of good food, good wine, hearty laughs, and yes, gelato. (The best gelato for this trip was in Siena, just across the plaza from the basilica, in case you're interested.)

Shortly before I left for Italy, the Diocese of Sacramento reminded all priests, deacons, and lay employees of its five-day quarantine policy for those returning from trips abroad. It annoyed me because I had honestly forgotten about it and hadn't planned for it, but more so because it meant that I had to ask Frs. David, Vincent, and Gregory to do more for a few more days after I returned. (They, being the gracious men they are, did not complain.) I also felt it was superfluous given the government's requirement to be COVID negative before reentering the country. That quarantine was the reason that you did not see me last Sunday for Corpus Christi and Father's Day, even though I was home.

I tested negative for COVID upon my return home to the US. Later, on day 3 of my Diocesemandated quarantine, I started feeling like I was coming down with a cold (my first since the pandemic), so I went to my room and didn't do anything with the friars for the rest of the day. When I woke up on day 4, this past Saturday, there was no doubt I was sick. I tested again and was positive for COVID. Of course, that reset my "quarantine clock" back to zero.

In all this, I and we are very blessed. 1. Because of the Diocese's policy, only a few people were exposed to me after I got home but before I was symptomatic. 2. None of my travel companions (as of writing this) have gotten sick (thank God!) so it seems I got COVID the "old fashioned way:" in the airport and/or on the airplane, though there is really no way to be sure. 3. Because of the Assembly, I had already arranged for Msgr. McLaughlin to be here this past week, so the essential sacramental work was covered.

I am grateful to be back home, recovering, and soon to be back in full swing at St. Dominic's!

Dear St. Dominic's Parishioners,

This morning the United States Supreme Court released a historic decision on Dobbs v.
Jackson Women's Health that overturned Roe v.
Wade and Casey. You can read Bishop Soto's response here <a href="https://www.scd.org/news/bringing-hope-post-roe-california">https://www.scd.org/news/bringing-hope-post-roe-california</a> Earlier in the week, Bp. Soto alerted us to federal law enforcement's discovery of an extremist group's manifesto calling for "extreme violence" against Catholic churches (and pregnancy centers) on the night of this decision's release. The bishop, of course, asked us to take this threat seriously. The staff and I have discussed these threats and have taken the following security measures for this weekend:

- the church will be locked at 6:00 pm, at least through this Sunday
- the Benicia police department has been made aware of the threat and will increase patrols around our property, especially during Sunday Masses
- security cameras have been installed throughout the property (video footage is the first thing the police department now asks for when we report an incident)

Please be particularly aware of your surroundings when you come to Mass and keep an extra eye out for our children, elderly, and disabled brothers and sisters. We can only hope and pray that this call for violence will go unheeded. May our Blessed Mother Mary, Queen of Peace, pray for our nation in these troubled days.
