Mission Cooperative Appeal

This coming weekend, July 16-17, we will have our annual Mission Appeal. As in years past, it will be given by our own Western Dominican Mission Office. This year our preacher will be the new Director of the Mission Foundation, Fr. Jordan Bradshaw, OP. Fr. Jordan just began this ministry. "I [Fr. Jordan] was born in Nogales, Sonora, Mexico and was raised across the border in Nogales, Arizona. I am the older brother to two wonderful and beautiful sisters who currently reside in Phoenix, Arizona. I am obsessed with walking, reading, and desperately figuring out how to keep my room clean and orderly.

"After attending Nogales High School, I headed to the University of Arizona, intent on studying psychology, but never forgetting my deep, early desire to become a priest. After being introduced to the Order of Preachers at the University of Arizona I entered the Western Dominican Province in 1983 and was ordained a priest in 1992. I have served for 28 years in various beloved assignments, from Oregon to Arizona, California to Washington, most recently as Director of Campus Ministry at the University of Washington's Prince of Peace Newman Center for 12 years.

"After a year's sabbatical and a semester at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, my current assignment, beginning in June 2022 is Director of the Dominican Mission Foundation, based in San Francisco. I look forward to learning about our various mission areas, first hand wherever possible, to preaching many of the mission appeals throughout California this summer, and to meeting many of you in my travels."
