Pastor's Corner

Holy Father St. Dominic

There is an old joke: "If you've met one Jesuit, you've met them all. If you've met one Dominican, you've met...one Dominican." I think this parish can attest to the truth of this: you have experienced lots of friars with a wide range of personalities and temperaments over the years. (I mean really, just think about the three wonderful Residency student brothers we have had since I have been here.) Like the Church herself, the Dominican Order is a big tent, with room for lots of different kinds of people. While I can't say this was directly intended by St. Dominic, it certainly seems he was very open to it.

One of the greatest contrasts between us and our revered cousins, the Franciscans, is the place the founder plays in the lives of the two orders. For the Franciscan family, St. Francis is very much front and center of their consciousness. Images of him abound. For Dominicans, St. Dominic is in the background. You will never find a statue of St. Dominic in a Dominican, or any other, backyard. (Fr. David has tried: he found a small statue of a dog that he put at the feet our St. Francis statue! He occasionally threatens to paint St. Francis' habit black and white.) At the risk of oversimplifying, to be a good Franciscan, one must imitate St. Francis; to be a good Dominican, one follows the structures St. Dominic gave us.

This speaks eloquently of the beauty and flexibility of the Order's governing structures. The Order can respond to the changing needs of the Church, the brethren, and the world over time. The Constitutions of the Order today are both very similar and very different than they were in the 13th, 15th, 17th, and 19th centuries. There is a story (legend?) in the early days of the two Orders that both St. Dominic and St. Francis wanted to make their respective orders more like the other, but both communities rejected those desires of the founders!

After founding the Order, St. Dominic was very aware of his role as the *pater familias* and used his magnetic personality to the fullest. (Note that he died only five years after the Order was founded!) He always strove to encourage those around him by setting a good example for them, not just by his exemplary preaching. He prayed for them unceasingly. He told his brothers on his deathbed, "I will be of more use to you in heaven than on earth." He was warm and affectionate to all and a cheerful companion. He was persistent in encouraging the members of his little flock never to settle for less than the demanding standards they had set for themselves.

May our Holy Father St. Dominic's witness continue to inspire us as a parish community and may he continue to pray for us to be vibrant, joyful disciples of Jesus. Happy feast day!
