I am pleased to begin a Principal's Corner so I may share with you, our parishioners, what is happening at St. Dominic School. We have been back in school for just over a month and we are all in full swing. Our kindergarten students, their parents, and teachers just walked by my office hand-in-hand on their way to the Benicia Library! The joy in their faces and skip in their step are a reflection of what I am so thankful to observe every day at SDS. Our 8th graders returned from a field trip to St. Patrick - St. Vincent High School this week in a similar style. They were able to visit classrooms, hear from students involved in different clubs and campus activities, enjoy a meal together, and really get a feel for all the great opportunities that SPSV has to offer! Our teachers work with their students in all that they do to prepare them for this next step in their education.

Every Monday morning our students gather in the Parish Hall to hear announcements and news from our student council officers in grades 6-8. We begin by inviting Jesus into their week and guide their day by praying the *Prayer of St. Dominic, and honoring God. With their teachers and classmates, the children also celebrate Mass and the Holy Eucharist one day per week; our junior high students attend with their "buddy classes" in grades K-2, and serve to set an example to their younger buddies.*

They concluded with the discussion question, "What can we do to become like God?"

I have been blessed with a dedicated and caring group of teachers and staff who share the same vision. We love this school, the students and families, and the community we serve. We are a family. We are also blessed with a close-knit community and a wonderful parent network.

As we gathered for the St. Dominic's Fall Festival on September 11th, it was a delight to see our community members enjoying time together under the same vision of communion, participation, and mission. We are looking forward to more of these gatherings in the future.

Peaceful, prayerful, effective 40 Days for Life campaign to build on successes in Vallejo/Benicia/American Cyn CA

Vallejo/Benicia/American Canyon CA – Dear brothers and sisters, beginning on September 22nd through October 31st 2021, the highly successful 40 Days for Life campaign returns to Vallejo with 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil and community outreach. I wanted to invite everyone to please prayerfully consider joining us by taking a one hour time slot on Wednesdays between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Our first day of public prayer begins on Wednesday September 22nd, and our last Wednesday will be October 27th.

40 Days for Life is a peaceful, highly-focused, non-denominational initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history.

If you are willing and able to come out and join other pro-life people for one hour per week, please make sure you are healthy, wear a mask, and maintain a 6' social distance from other prayer partners. The vigil will take place in the public right-of-way outside Planned Parenthood at 303 Sacramento St. Vallejo, CA. All vigil participants are requested to pray for peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christian like manner at all times.

Rosemary Mullane is our current 40 Days for life leader for all four parishes while I remain our St. Dominic's contact person. Rosemary Mullane is down at the PP facility on a regular basis and has invited anyone who is interested and able to meet at 3pm on Friday September 10th and 17th to pray the divine mercy chaplet. While there for that hour of power, she is willing to help anyone who would like to download the 40 Days for life App on their smartphone and log in to see where people can sign up for an hour of prayer during the vigil. I hope many of you will take her up on helping get that free App set up and pray together one of those afternoons. Thanks and God Bless.
