## **Principal's Corner**

By His wounds, you were healed (1 Peter 2:24)

I am an adult child of divorce (ACOD). My parents separated when I was 7 and divorced when I was 8 years old. I am only now, at 52, realizing the extent of the damage those events have wrought in my life. My parents had a so-called "good" divorce: there was no abuse, violence, addiction, or anything like that. But it is also true that my first childhood memory is after my father moved out of the house: I clearly remember lying to a neighbor why she hadn't seen my dad for a while (I told her that he was on a business trip even though he was a corporate accountant). Unlike some of my friends at the time. both parents continued to be a part of my life; it necessitated a lot of time in the car, shuttling between their two homes, especially after my dad moved back to Santa Rosa and remarried (and re-divorced).

Let me be perfectly clear. The only statement I am making about divorce is a personal one: I was hurt by my parents' separation and divorce, regardless of or even despite their best intentions and efforts to protect me from its effects.

You may remember me sharing briefly about my experience last spring with a new ministry to ACOD's called <u>Life-Giving Wounds</u>. It is ministry to those of us whose parents are separated or divorced, not for those who are separated or divorced from their spouses (unless their parents are divorced, too). There are ministries in the Church to the separated and divorced; this ministry to the children of divorced or separated parents is completely novel and unique. The Archdiocese of San Francisco helped produce a promotional video, which you can see <u>Life Giving Wounds Retreat for Adult Children of Divorce-YouTube</u>.


I am honored and delighted to have been asked to be a part of the team for the second West coast Life-Giving Wounds [Life-Giving Wounds Healing Retreat - Archdiocese of San Francisco (sfarchdiocese.org)] and to give one of the talks. It will be November 18-20 at Vallombrosa Retreat Center in Menlo Park. It is primarily geared to young adults, but any adult is welcome to apply; I was the oldest attendee when I went back in March, though I understand that a 60-year old has already signed up for November.

I want to extend a particular invitation to school parents whose parents are separated or divorce to attend the next weekend. It will be a challenge, for sure, but I hope, like me, you will find strength in being with other ACOD's and a renewed sense of hope for your own healing, especially in your vocation as a spouse and a parent.





#### Peaceful, prayerful, effective 40 Days for Life campaign to build on successes in Vallejo/Benicia/American Cyn CA

Vallejo/Benicia/American Canyon CA – Dear brothers and sisters, beginning on September 22nd through October 31st 2021, the highly successful 40 Days for Life campaign returns to Vallejo with 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil and community outreach. I wanted to invite everyone to please prayerfully consider joining us by taking a one hour time slot on Wednesdays between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Our first day of public prayer begins on Wednesday September 22nd, and our last Wednesday will be October 27th.

40 Days for Life is a peaceful, highly-focused, nondenominational initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history.

If you are willing and able to come out and join other pro-life people for one hour per week, please make sure you are healthy, wear a mask, and maintain a 6' social distance from other prayer partners. The vigil will take place in the public right-of-way outside Planned Parenthood at 303 Sacramento St. Vallejo, CA. All vigil participants are requested to pray for peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christian like manner at all times.

Rosemary Mullane is our current 40 Days for life leader for all four parishes while I remain our St. Dominic's contact person. Rosemary Mullane is down at the PP facility on a regular basis and has invited anyone who is interested and able to meet at 3pm on Friday September 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> to pray the divine mercy chaplet. While there for that hour of power, she is willing to help anyone who would like to download the 40 Days for life App on their smartphone and log in to see where people can sign up for an hour of prayer during the vigil. I hope many of you will take her up on helping get that free App set up and pray together one of those afternoons. Thanks and God Bless.
