Brother's Corner

Study Days on the Eucharist

Tuesday through Friday this week, I was away at the Diocese of Sacramento's Priest Study Days, hosted at the Passionist Retreat House in Citrus Heights. Fr. Gregory was actually scheduled to go this year, but he kindly suggested I go since he had been away so much these last two months. I am grateful for the respite, the fraternal time with the priests of the Diocese, and the intellectual stimulation.

The presenter was a young professor from St. Meinrad Seminary in Indiana, Dr. Jonathan Ciraulo. I found out in short order that he lives in Kentucky, and along with his wife and children, are parishioners at St. Louis Bertrand, the Dominican parish in Louisville. That parish was founded a few years after we were, in 1866. The theme for the week was the Eucharistic Revival.

The beauty of sessions like these, when done well, is that it gets us out of ourselves and consider things afresh. The title of Professor Ciraulo's first book, recently published, tells you why he was asked to talk to us: "The Eucharistic Form of God: Hans Urs von Balthasar's Sacramental Theology." The overarching theme of the 10 talks (!) he gave us was that Jesus' complete giving of himself to us in the Eucharist mirrors what God has been doing throughout salvation history and that our worship and reception of this great sacrament is intended to empower us to do the same.

He had a beautiful session on the Eucharistic Priest, where is showed how God uses both saintly priests (he used newly canonized St. Charles de Foucauld as this example) and "scoundrel" or mediocre priests (he used the priest from Georges Bernanos' classic "The Diary of a Country Priest" as this example) eucharistically. What he meant by that is that as long as we intend to do what the Church would have us do, even if we are not as personally holy as we should be, Christ will feed and nourish the Church and the world. It was both comforting and inspiring. Comforting, because like anyone with a shred of selfawareness, I often confront and am confronted by my personal and moral shortcomings. Inspiring, because it frees me from trying to strive for "perfection" in my own image and likeness, to get out of the way, and let God use the tool he created (me) in the way that best suits Him.

The challenging message for all members of the Church, is we are to imitate what we receive in the Eucharist: like Christ, we are to pour ourselves out completely for the life of world.

Vallejo/Benicia/American Canyon CA – Dear brothers and sisters, beginning on September 22nd through October 31st 2021, the highly successful 40 Days for Life campaign returns to Vallejo with 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil and community outreach. I wanted to invite everyone to please prayerfully consider joining us by taking a one hour time slot on Wednesdays between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Our first day of public prayer begins on Wednesday September 22nd, and our last Wednesday will be October 27th.
