Pastor's Corner

Mary: Mother of God

In the midst of Christmas and its many associated feasts, the Church calls us to reflect on Jesus' first and greatest disciple: his mother, Mary. Prior to the revision of the liturgical calendar mandated by Vatican II, today's feast was that of the Circumcision of Jesus. That feast reminded us that our Lord and Savior grew up in a pious, observant Jewish home. It is interesting to note that the Gospel for today's Mass still recounts that event; most other feasts honoring Mary use texts from the Annunciation or the Visitation for the Gospel. (Earlier in Luke's narrative, when recounting John the Baptist's birth, it was at John's circumcision that his father regained the ability to speak and prophesied about his son, causing those in attendance to ask, "What, then, will this child be?" *Cf.* Lk. 1:57-80) The 8th day after the birth of a male child

The 8th day after the birth of a male child marked not only a time for the circumcision, but also for the first purification (of a total of two) of the baby's mother. This involved the washing of her body, clothing and anything on which she had sat while giving birth. Jewish purity laws speak of two central areas of daily Jewish life: domestic/familial relationships and Temple worship. When one became impure according to the Law one's relationship to one's family and/or to God (via the Temple) temporarily changed. The ending or removal of an impurity signified that one's normal relationship to God and others was restored.

Many cultures have rituals for the mother surrounding childbirth; Judaism is not unique. For many cultures, childbirth is a unique time when mothers are removed from "normal life" and are in closer communion with the divine. So these rituals were about restoring her to "normal" relationships with the community. Even in Christianity there was a ritual called the "Churching of Women." It came from a time when babies were Baptized immediately after birth, thus most mothers were not present at the Baptism because they were still in the early stages of recuperation. The prayers of this rite spoke of the mother's healing after giving birth, her gratitude for her child's safe delivery and also that she would soon rejoin the Church community in her new role as Mother.

All of this to say that it is not a great leap from focusing on Jesus' circumcision to focusing on Mary on this day. We focus on the reality that Mary is the *Theotokos*, literally the God-bearer in Greek, which gets translated into Latin as *Mater* Dei and to English as Mother of God. It is under this august title that we honor her today.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God!

Dear Friends in Christ:

The Catholic Faithful and all people of goodwill are encouraged to observe Friday, January 20, 2023, as a Day of Reparation for the practice of abortion and other violations against human dignity that cry to heaven. Let us make reparations for these sins through fasting, prayer, penance, and works of mercy

In 2022, Roe v. Wade was overturned by the Supreme Court. This landmark decision has brought a new moment in the efforts to foster a culture of life and dignity. Proponents of a throw-away society persist in closing their minds and hearts to imagining a world without abortion. In the State of California, voters passed Proposition 1, which has embedded the practice of abortion in the State Constitution. Abortion is still legal, without limitation and now may be expanded because of Proposition 1. Recognizing the tragedy of legalized abortion still gripping our state, I have designated Friday, January 20th as a Day of Reparation.

I ask the clergy and laity to join me in offering a Mass of Reparation on Friday, January 20, 2023, 12:05 pm at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.

I propose to my brother priests and deacons that we pray and preach for a merciful end to abortion as well as a renewed promotion of the Gospel of Life on the weekend of January 14-15. Encourage all parishioners to observe the Day of Reparation on January 20th.

The Offices of Family & Faith Formation and Youth & Young Adult Ministry will provide the following local Respect Life activities in January:

- January 11-19th The Diocesan Pro-Life Eucharistic Adoration (PLEA) Novena will be led by different parishes each day. This will be an opportunity to unite pro-life efforts with the saving work of Jesus in the Eucharist. May Jesus, "the Bread of Life" (Jn. 6.35), help us nourish the world with the gospel of life.
