

#### **Pastor's Corner**

Jubilee!


This year, on May 29, I will celebrate my 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of priestly ordination. Of the five of us that were ordained that day, three of us are still in active ministry, one has died, and one left the priesthood. Currently, two of us (Fr. Steven Maekawa and me) are pastors, and one is a professor at our school in Rome, the Pontifical University of St. Thomas, more commonly known as the Angelicum. The one who serves at the Angelicum, Fr. Alejandro Crosthwaite, and I were also ordained deacons together in January 1997 in the crypt church of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC.

Looking ahead on the calendar, the weekend of May 28 is Memorial Day weekend and the culmination of the Easter season, the great feast of Pentecost. (This is a happy accident: May 29, 1998, was the Friday before Pentecost.) Our 8<sup>th</sup> graders will graduate that Friday evening. As of right now, I am thinking about having a special 5:00 pm Mass on Sunday, May 28, followed by some kind of reception or party. I will celebrate an anniversary Mass at the 8:15 on my actual anniversary, Monday, May 29. Following that I am planning on taking a month-long celebratory trip with my classmates. As of this writing, we haven't decided on a destination; every time we talk about it, we have different ideas. (But fear not, we will decide, eventually!)

Why am I telling you all this, five months ahead of time? I'm glad you asked. One of the "gifts" that the Province gives to jubilarians, 25<sup>th</sup> and 50<sup>th</sup>, is two extra months of time off. This week, I will be starting one of those bonus times. I am going on an extended, month-long, retreat at one of my favorite monasteries down in Big Sur. I will be away from St. Dominic's from January 18 to February 18. While I am away, Fr. Gregory will be in charge of day-to-day operations. Helping with the sacramental ministry while I am away will be former Provincial, Fr. Emmerich Vogt, O.P., a member of our Western Dominican Preaching team. Many of his missions center around addiction recovery and the Christian application of the 12 Steps. (You can learn a bit about him at https://opwest.org/itinerant-preaching) He will give a parish mission the last week of January; look out for those details. I first met Fr. Emmerich when I was an undergraduate at St. Mary's College in Moraga; he was a great help and support in fostering my Dominican vocation back in the day. I am delighted he was available to help in my absence; I know you will be well taken care of.

Know that you will be in my prayers while I am on retreat. Please keep me, as well as Frs. Steven and Alejandro, in your prayers!

After a reflection on the nature of God as revealed by Christ, and taking his cue from what Jesus reveals to us by His own words and works, Father's conferences will spell out the concrete steps needed in the life of every wounded Christian — Christians wounded by Original Sin and by personal sin, and in that context situate the Cross of Redemption.

an professor of philosophy who has written over eighty wonderful books on Christian philosophy, theology, and apologetics. In one of his books he reminds us that most of us may not be addicted to alcohol or drugs, but we are to impatience, pride, anger, lust. In other words, we are addicted to sin. Thus we can call ourselves "sinaholics." Father Emmerich will focus on the steps needed by "sinaholics" that give us access to the life of grace as Sacred Scripture reveals.

By leading the parishioners in an exploration of the guiding principles that lead to a deep inner peace in the midst of a troubled world, his conferences will focus on our Catholic understanding of God and the principles needed for recovery from the effects of sin in our lives, as well as other issues of our spiritual warfare.

Fr. Emmerich is a priest of the Holy Name Province of the Dominican Order and is currently the Director of the Saint Jude Shrine at St. Dominic's Church, San Francisco, while also ministering with Western Dominican Preaching.

For the past forrty years he has been involved in giving retreats and seminars to Mother Teresa's Priests and Sisters in Mexico, Poland, Guatemala, Uruquay, Calcutta, Matacascar, Russia, and Africa. He currently resides at St. Dominic Priory, San Francisco, CA.

#### **COLLECTIONS/OVERALL OPERATIONS**

During the latter part of the 2021/22 fiscal year, staffing, programming and events started to return to pre-pandemic levels resulting in a 7.8% increase in operating expenses over FY 2020/21. Although Mass attendance and donations are also on the rise, the increase in operating income was only 3.7%, which resulted in a net operating loss of approximately \$84,000. Fortunately, with government COVID relief programs we did not need to dip into our savings.

#### **CAPITAL PROJECTS**

We continue to work on capital projects as funds become available. The Parish Hall cupola repair and window replacement was completed in summer of 2022. In addition, repairs and new HVAC units were needed in the parish office due to a major water leak, we painted the "Little House" on J Street and updated our alarm system in the Parish Hall. Bids for parking lot repaving will be gathered soon for work to be done this Summer.

#### **DIOCESAN ASSESSMENT**

This year's annual assessment from the diocese was \$173,124. This amount is taken out from the parish's regular operations.

#### Dear Friends in Christ:

The Catholic Faithful and all people of goodwill are encouraged to observe Friday, January 20, 2023, as a Day of Reparation for the practice of abortion and other violations against human dignity that cry to heaven. Let us make reparations for these sins through fasting, prayer, penance, and works of mercy

In 2022, Roe v. Wade was overturned by the Supreme Court. This landmark decision has brought a new moment in the efforts to foster a culture of life and dignity. Proponents of a throw-away society persist in closing their minds and hearts to imagining a world without abortion. In the State of California, voters passed Proposition 1, which has embedded the practice of abortion in the State Constitution. Abortion is still legal, without limitation and now may be expanded because of Proposition 1. Recognizing the tragedy of legalized abortion still gripping our state, I have designated Friday, January 20th as a Day of Reparation.

I ask the clergy and laity to join me in offering a Mass of Reparation on Friday, January 20, 2023, 12:05 pm at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.

I propose to my brother priests and deacons that we pray and preach for a merciful end to abortion as well as a renewed promotion of the Gospel of Life on the weekend of January 14-15. Encourage all parishioners to observe the Day of Reparation on January 20th.

The Offices of Family & Faith Formation and Youth & Young Adult Ministry will provide the following local Respect Life activities in January:

- January 11-19th The Diocesan Pro-Life Eucharistic Adoration (PLEA) Novena will be led by
  different parishes each day. This will be an opportunity to unite pro-life efforts with the saving
  work of Jesus in the Eucharist. May Jesus, "the Bread of Life" (Jn. 6.35), help us nourish the world


