

#### **Associate Pastor's Corner**

You may remember that in my homily last Sunday (the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time), I stressed the importance for everybody, laity and clergy alike, to spread the Gospel. You might wonder if what I said was realistic. It is, and in recent years, we have seen more and more very intentional Catholics organize various evangelistic efforts, such St. Paul Street Evangelization (https://streetevangelization.com). Today, I want to share with you an inspiring example of a lay missionary, whom I know personally, who spreads the Gospel overseas.

My dear friend, Tricia Bølle, is an indefatigable lay missionary to Asia. She holds a master's degree in East Asian studies from Stanford and speaks Japanese and Chinese fluently. In her travels through East Asia, she noticed great needs of the Church in that part of the world. And so, when she graduated from Stanford, she gave up a promising career and became a "free-lens" missionary. According to Tricia, since most Asians are not Christians, a simple sign of the cross before meal can serve as a powerful witness of faith. Quite often, upon seeing this telltale sign of Christian faith, locals would ask her about her faith in Jesus Christ. This then would be her opportunity to share the Gospel with them. In the meantime, she volunteered as various church communities and helped organize young adult fellowships in various parts of Asia. Gradually, the Holy Spirit moved her to make her evangelistic efforts more concerted and to train more missionaries to join her. As a result, she started St. Francis Xavier Lay Missionary Society (https:// www.laymissionary.org), which is "is a Catholic lay missionary apostolate serving in Asia dedicated to sharing the light and love of Jesus Christ -- particularly with young adults." It is also "dedicated to the formation, sending and support of Catholic lay missionaries to bring the love of Jesus Christ to others in Asia, through a diverse ministry of evangelization, faith formation, and social justice."

I got to know Tricia Bølle about ten years ago in San Francisco, when I was a novice. I admired greatly her zeal and courage in spreading the Gospel in places thousands of miles from home, and we became fast friends. Before I knew it, I was invited to help. In fact, I am not the only Dominican friar who support Tricia and St. Francis Xavier Lay Missionary Society. She has been supported by Dominicans from around the world, because they find in Tricia a true kindred spirit, sharing the same enthusiasm of preaching the Gospel unto the ends of the earth.

This week, our parish has the great joy of hosting Tricia and the spring formation program of St. Francis Xavier Lay Missionary Society from January 23 to January 28. A zealous young man called Ethan will receive training, in the hope of serving as a lay missionary in the near future. You will be able meet them at Masses. I would highly encourage you to say hi to them and ensure them of your support.

Father Emmerich comes to Saint Dominic Parish for the Mission to reflect on the goodness, beauty, and truth of the faith with which God has gifted us.

#### How to Understand Suffering and a God who loves us.

After a reflection on the nature of God as revealed by Christ, and taking his cue from what Jesus reveals to us by His own words and works, Father's conferences will spell out the concrete steps needed in the life of every wounded Christian — Christians wounded by Original Sin and by personal sin, and in that context situate the Cross of Redemption.

any are familiar with the writings of the Catholic convert Peter Kreeft, a professor of philosophy who has written over eighty wonderful books on Christian philosophy, theology, and apologetics. In one of his books he reminds us that most of us may not be addicted to alcohol or drugs, but we are to impatience, pride, anger, lust. In other words, we are addicted to sin. Thus we can call ourselves "sinaholics." Father Emmerich will focus on the steps needed by "sinaholics" that give us access to the life of grace as Sacred Scripture reveals.

By leading the parishioners in an exploration of the guiding principles that lead to a deep inner peace in the midst of a troubled world, his conferences will focus on our Catholic understanding of God and the principles needed for recovery from the effects of sin in our lives, as well as other issues of our spiritual warfare.

Fr. Emmerich is a priest of the Holy Name Province of the Dominican Order and is currently the Director of the Saint Jude Shrine at St. Dominic's Church, San Francisco, while also ministering with Western Dominican Preaching.

For the past forrty years he has been involved in giving retreats and seminars to Mother Teresa's Priests and Sisters in Mexico, Poland, Guatemala, Uruquay, Calcutta, Matacascar, Russia, and Africa. He currently resides at St. Dominic Priory, San Francisco, CA.

#### **COLLECTIONS/OVERALL OPERATIONS**

During the latter part of the 2021/22 fiscal year, staffing, programming and events started to return to pre-pandemic levels resulting in a 7.8% increase in operating expenses over FY 2020/21. Although Mass attendance and donations are also on the rise, the increase in operating income was only 3.7%, which resulted in a net operating loss of approximately \$84,000. Fortunately, with government COVID relief programs we did not need to dip into our savings.

#### **CAPITAL PROJECTS**

We continue to work on capital projects as funds become available. The Parish Hall cupola repair and window replacement was completed in summer of 2022. In addition, repairs and new HVAC units were needed in the parish office due to a major water leak, we painted the "Little House" on J Street and updated our alarm system in the Parish Hall. Bids for parking lot repaving will be gathered soon for work to be done this Summer.

#### **DIOCESAN ASSESSMENT**

This year's annual assessment from the diocese was \$173,124. This amount is taken out from the parish's regular operations.
