Pastor's Corner

20 + C + M + B + 23

This is not some cryptic code. It is actually something you might see above doorways, especially this time of year. It is a house blessing associated with the feast of the Epiphany. 2023 stands for the year; the crosses are, well, crosses; C, M, and B stand for either the names tradition gives to the three magi/ kings: Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar or for *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, Latin for "Christ Blesses (this) House." Until a few years ago, I had only heard of the former meaning and others only know the latter. According to the internet, both are right.

Devotions such as these are forms of popular piety: expressions of the faith of the people that occur outside of Mass. While devotions such as this are strictly "optional," they can be a powerful help to a healthy living out of ones' faith. "The Second Vatican Council nevertheless reminds us that 'the spiritual life. however, is not limited solely to participation in the Liturgy' (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 12). The spiritual life of the faithful is also nourished by "the pious practices of the Christian people'..." (Pope St. John Paul II, September 21, 2001) "Authentic expressions of popular piety are not at odds with the centrality of the [Mass]. Rather, in promoting the faith of the people, who regard popular piety as a natural religious expression, they predispose the people for the celebration of the Sacred Mysteries." (Congregation for Divine Worshipand the Discipline of the Sacraments, December 17, 2001)

Epiphany kits, with Holy Water and blessed chalk will be available after all the Masses this weekend, and until we run out.

Here is a suggested way of blessing your home with blessed Epiphany chalk:

- Use the blessed chalk to write 20+C+M+B+23 above the main entrance. You can also do this over other outside doors or even inside doorways.
- 2. As you are writing, pray one of the following prayers:
- May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus Christ who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.
- Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
- Lord our God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the joyful keeping of your law. We give thanks to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.



Dear Friends in Christ:

The Catholic Faithful and all people of goodwill are encouraged to observe Friday, January 20, 2023, as a Day of Reparation for the practice of abortion and other violations against human dignity that cry to heaven. Let us make reparations for these sins through fasting, prayer, penance, and works of mercy

In 2022, Roe v. Wade was overturned by the Supreme Court. This landmark decision has brought a new moment in the efforts to foster a culture of life and dignity. Proponents of a throw-away society persist in closing their minds and hearts to imagining a world without abortion. In the State of California, voters passed Proposition 1, which has embedded the practice of abortion in the State Constitution. Abortion is still legal, without limitation and now may be expanded because of Proposition 1. Recognizing the tragedy of legalized abortion still gripping our state, I have designated Friday, January 20th as a Day of Reparation.

I ask the clergy and laity to join me in offering a Mass of Reparation on Friday, January 20, 2023, 12:05 pm at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Sacramento.

I propose to my brother priests and deacons that we pray and preach for a merciful end to abortion as well as a renewed promotion of the Gospel of Life on the weekend of January 14-15. Encourage all parishioners to observe the Day of Reparation on January 20th.

The Offices of Family & Faith Formation and Youth & Young Adult Ministry will provide the following local Respect Life activities in January:

- January 11-19th The Diocesan Pro-Life Eucharistic Adoration (PLEA) Novena will be led by different parishes each day. This will be an opportunity to unite pro-life efforts with the saving work of Jesus in the Eucharist. May Jesus, "the Bread of Life" (Jn. 6.35), help us nourish the world with the gospel of life.
