

Pastor's Corner

It is finished...but not like we expected

"It is finished" is the sixth of the seven last "words" of Jesus from the Cross. It is easy to relate this word to our own experience of being at the end of a long and arduous trial. For me, it also carries a sense of relief: "I don't have to do this anymore, phew." When Jesus spoke this, he was at the end of his Passion: a series of physical, mental, and emotional tortures that pushed the limits of human endurance with the end just moments away.

But it was not finished, not by a long shot. Our celebration of the Triduum does not end with Jesus entombed on Good Friday; if it were so, then Jesus would be just another in long line of prophets and visionaries (which continues into our own day) put to death for their witness. The Apostles and disciples clearly thought at first that Jesus' death was the end, even though he had explicitly told them it would not be.

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts." (Isaiah 55:8-9). God's ending to the story, which was in mind from the beginning, was Jesus' Resurrection. Jesus as God irrevocably emptied death of its power over the human race by undergoing His Passion and death.

This is the joy of the Easter message: death is not the end! St. Paul put it clearly, even mockingly, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Cor. 15:55) The joy of personally experiencing the Risen Lord transforms Mary Magdalene, the Apostles, and every Christian by allowing them to see beyond the horizon of death to endless life with God for eternity, definitively revealed in Jesus risen from the dead.

Truly, Christ is Risen! Alleluia! A special welcome to our visitors. You are welcome anytime. The friars, deacons, and parish staff wish all of you a most blessed and glorious Easter! Week in and week out, St. Dominic's strive to live in the light and glory of Jesus' Resurrection, both as individuals and as a community.

Don't forget that St. Dominic's next pastor, Fr. Andy Opsahl, OP, will be visiting us next weekend. This will be his only visit before beginning his new ministry here on July 1, so don't miss this opportunity to meet him.



40 Days for Life is a peaceful, highly-focused, nondenominational initiative that focuses on 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil at abortion facilities, and grassroots educational outreach. The 40-day time frame is drawn from examples throughout Biblical history. All prayer vigil participants are requested to pray for peace, pledging to conduct themselves in a Christ-like manner at all times.

El Cerrito, California

A woman with a HUGE problem showed up for an abortion in El Cerrito. California. She had conceived a



affair--and there was no hiding her infidelity because her husband had been sterilized. But before she went through with it, she spoke with 40 Days for Life participants, who gave her the courage to own up to her mistake without killing her child. "The lady chose life and is going to ask her husband for forgiveness," wrote Ana, the local leader. Ana said the woman is afraid to tell her husband the difficult news--but she plans to fight for her marriage. The love, humility, and self-sacrifice of vigil participants sends a message of hope into even the most difficult situations. "We continue to pray in the rain," Ana said. And that's why the El Cerrito campaign has saved three babies this spring.

Walnut Creek, California



An abortion-bound couple stopped to talk with 40 Days for Life participants standing vigil on a cold, wet Friday morning. A Sidewalk Outreach volunteer spoke with the pair for several minutes, sharing resources and alternatives to abortion. The couple continued into Planned Parenthood's parking lot, but sat in their car talking for two hours.

"Our volunteers continued fervently praying for a change of heart and mind," said Jodie from the campaign team. Prayer warriors even texted other campaign participants to increase prayer. Pro-lifers' hearts sank when the couple went into the abortion center...but rose again when they left just ten minutes later. "Life triumphed!" Jodie wrote. "Praise God!
