

Brother's Corner

Transfigured wounds

When I first entered religious life I was attracted to and perplexed by the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Think about it, when we are wounded or have an imperfection like a scar or pimple, we cover it up so as not to draw



attention to it. Jesus on the other hand does the opposite and invites his disciples to look at and even touch his open wounds. This week we celebrated the solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Why do we celebrate a wounded heart? Why does Jesus keep his wounds after rising from the dead?

As you have probably noticed in my weekly talks on the art of Fra Angelico, I love to think about theology through the lens of beauty. In Matthias Grunewald's Isenheim altarpiece we contemplate the horror of the cross where Jesus took on our infirmities in order to heal us by his wounds. The artist brilliantly conveys this by depicting Jesus with the same gruesome symptoms of ergotism that the patients in the hospital were suffering from. Day by day, they would be able to contemplate this image and experience that they were not alone in their suffering. Jesus carried the cross before them and he is carrying the cross with them now. His heart is literally ripped open to pour out his life giving love. On major liturgical feasts, such as Easter, the altarpiece would open up to a stunning depiction of the Resurrected Christ, ascending effortlessly from the tomb as the master and head of the cosmos. He is the never setting sun of justice that shines in the darkness. "Death no longer has any power over him" (Rm 6:9). Grunewald opened up for those suffering in this valley of tears a view into the divine destiny of Jesus' and their wounds. These same wounds that inflicted so much pain are now glorious.

On the night of Easter Sunday Jesus passes through the locked doors of fear and appears to his apostles who abandoned him and shows them his wounds. St Thomas Aquinas says, "A problem arises here because there can be no defects in a glorified body, and wounds are defects. How then can there be wounds in the body of Christ?" The angelic doctor answers that Jesus' Sacred Wounds are the trophies of his victory over death and the proof of his love for us. Jesus shows his disciples his wounds, and invites us to touch them and to take refuge in them. He implores his disciples, "Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself (cf. Lk 24:39), the God made man to take your wounds and to transform them into sources of mercy and peace. Contemplate my wounded heart pouring out my divine love. It is the new and living path through the curtain of his flesh to the inner sanctuary (cf. Heb. 10:20). It is the only way to the Father (cf. Jn 14:6), and the gate to holiness" (cf. Ps 118:19).



This masterpiece of Grunwald was

created to lead us to contemplate during the Mass the mystery of the Incarnate Word "who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification" (Rm 4:25). We saw that after Easter the Lord did not magically solve all our problems and take away all our suffering. But Jesus wants to trace a way in the wilderness of our wounds so that our suffering is not meaningless because it is united to his pierced heart. He wants to transfigure our wounds so that they too may be the trophies of our victory over evil and a source of mercy and peace. "In heaven these wounds in their body will not be a deformity, but a dignity" (St Augustine, City of God, Bk 22).





Organ Prelude: "Nimrod" from Enigma Variations by Edward Elgar

"Nimrod" is one of the Enigma Variations Sir Edwad Elgar composed 1898-1899, a cycle of variations on an original theme. The name "Nimrod" refers to <u>Augustus J. Jaeger</u>, who was a music editor by the London publisher Novello & Co. He was a close friend of Elgar's, giving him useful advice but also severe criticism, something Elgar greatly appreciated. <u>Nimrod</u> is described in the <u>Old Testament</u> as "a mighty hunter before the Lord".

Organ Postlude: "Morning Tribute", arr. Lyndell Leatherman

This arrangement by Leatherman combines several music sources: "Per Gynt", an orchestral suite by Norwegian composer Edward Grieg, and hymn tunes "Morning Has Broken" and "When Morning Gilds the Skies"



Theology through Beauty: The *Summa* in Paint of Blessed Fra Angelico, O.P. Series with Br. John Paul

We will contemplate the core mysteries of the Christian Faith through the paintings of Bl. Fra Angelico, OP, the patron saint of artists. Pope St John Paul II describes this 15th-century Dominican best. "Spiritual son of Saint Dominic, he expressed his "summa" of the divine mysteries with his brush, just as Thomas Aquinas enunciated it with theological language." This will not be abstract theology but a practical school of prayer and meditation on Scripture with the help of this great artist who contemplated the Sacred humanity of Jesus Christ and shared the fruits of his contemplation. The beauty of his art can practically heal the wounded imagination and deepen our relationship with Jesus and Mary.
