Pastor's Corner



With the academic year having just begun this past week at St.

Dominic's School here at the parish, it's a great occasion for all of us to reflect on how we hope to grow in the coming months. Obviously, many people choose to think about this sort of thing around January

1st. but I love to do it this time of year. The beginning of the school year has never lost its sense of a fresh start for me. I hope I never stop feeling that way. Of course, to know how we hope to improve, we need to ruminate on how we have grown or stagnated in the previous months. The lead-up to the start of school is a great time for getting such clarity. After all, this life is meant to be a pilgrimage to Heaven, and advancing in spiritual maturity is what quickens us on that path. Coasting on the status quo or even backsliding are very easy ruts to stay in for long periods of time without noticing if we do not check in on our progress, regularly.

For example, it helps to ask ourselves if we are allowing life's daily grind to crowd out time for talking to God and worshipping him. Reflecting routinely on how we have been treating others is also essential, especially those with whom we live. If we are not careful, it can be easy to take our closest family members and friends for granted, given that if we snap at them, they are less likely to drop us as a result than people we know less well. Also corrosive to our spiritual growth is too much time in front of screens. If I am not careful, I can waste a lot of time watching interviews with famous people to the point that I lack time for study that can deepen my faith and preaching.

Again, the start of the school year is a great time for asking ourselves these sorts of questions and coming up with concrete actions to accomplish improvement. With a life in which so many difficulties are out of our control, the ability to improve our character and overall spiritual lives is always within grasp, assuming we have some control of our mental and emotional faculties, of course. As the kids begin their fresh start on campus, let us all take a fresh start at living our lives in ways that, with the help of God's grace, can bring us closer to him and to each other. Happy first week of school, everybody!







Music Notes - August 20, 2023

Prelude: "Pavane for a dead princess" by Maurice Ravel, arr. for organ by Dennis Janzer

Pavane for a Dead Princess (Pavane pour une infante défunte) is a well known piano piece by the French composer Maurice Ravel. It was composed in 1899 and published in 1900 and later in orchestrated version in 1910. Ravel described the piece as "an evocation of a pavane that a little princess [Infanta] might, in former times, have danced at the Spanish court. Its prayerful mood invokes a culture of reverence practiced in the Catholic Spanish court for centuries.

Postlude: "Wedding day in Troldhaugen" by Edward Grieg

This joyful and celebratory piece was written for the 25th wedding anniversary of Grieg and his wife Nina. The work's festive march-like first section, describes congratulations and best wishes that are given by the guests to the newly-weds; the second section is reflective and subdued.

Communion meditation for 7:30 Mass:

The Lord is my shepherd (Psalm 23) by Keith Green

Keith Gordon Green (1953 – 1982) was an American gospel singer, songwriter, musician originally from Sheepshead Bay, Brooklyn, New York. Beyond his music, Green is best known for his strong devotion to Christian evangelism and challenging others to do the same. He wrote some notable songs alone or with his wife, Melody Green.
