Pastor's Corner



As many of you know, for the past few months we have a done a family Eucharistic Adoration night on the last Friday of the month and plan to continue offering them. One of my favorite aspects of this monthly event is that it provides families an occasion for praying together. Family

prayer is essential if we want our kids to grow in their faith and progressively take more personal ownership of it. Accomplishing this goal usually does not happen without persistent effort. For example, I have often heard from exasperated parents who said things like, "Father Andy, what are we doing wrong with our kids? We go to a lot of trouble to drag them to mass in the midst of sports, homework, and other stuff, and all they do is complain about how they have to go to church in the first place!" In many cases, the parents are doing nothing wrong. It's just kids being kids. In some situations, however, part of the problem is that the families in question do not make their faith much of a priority beyond attending mass on Sundays. The faith is not talked about much at home and does not really influence many family choices. If a child grows up in an environment like this, we should not be surprised if he or she has trouble seeing the importance of going to Mass on Sundays. I do not point this out to judge such families, because it is easy for that sort of thing to happen to any of us. One of many remedies is to make sure on a regular basis families thank God for the blessings he has already bestowed and ask him for things the family needs or desires. For example, let's say a parent is in between employment and currently interviewing for a job he or she thinks would be very good for the family. This is a great occasion for that family to pray that the parent gets the job if it is God's will. When we engage in such prayers, it can be a helpful reminder of how reliant we all are on God and the interior peace that can come from accepting his will. Another helpful family ritual is to read the coming Sunday's Gospel ahead of time, so that the family has an easier time engaging with that Gospel at Sunday mass. This is something we aim to provide with the family Eucharistic Adoration nights. On that evening, we read the Gospel in front of the Blessed Sacrament, and a guided meditation is offered, along with praise music and sacred silence. The Adoration lasts for a half-hour, and then the families enjoy food and fellowship afterwards, so that they have a chance to build friendships in order to support each other. A proper Catholic upbringing consists of numerous little ways, like those just mentioned, of keeping God at the center of life. Let's all do what we can to support each other in that most important goal!

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who are baptized, have received First Communion, and have received religious instruction since their First Communion, but for various reasons were never received the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for Saturday, November 4, 2023, St. Mary's Church, 350 Stinson Ave., Vacaville, 5:00 p.m. Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing 8 sessions held over a series of consecutive Sundays from September 10, 2023 through October 29, 2023, 2:00-3:30 p.m., St. Dominic's Ministry Center, Siena Rm.

Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, and have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate certified within the past 6 months. Confirmation candidates must select a Sponsor who must be Catholic, received the Sacrament of Confirmation, is a practicing Catholic, and is at least 16 years of age.



Organ Prelude: Reflective Interlude in E by Colin Mawby

Colin Mawby (9 May 1936 – 24 November 2019) was an English organist, choral conductor and composer. From 1961 he was Master of Music at Westminster Cathedral, then from 1981 he was the choral director at Radio Telefís Éireann. He composed masses dedicated to specific choirs, including in Germany. He was awarded Knighthood of the Order of St. Gregory in 2006.

This arrangement by Leatherman combines two ancient hymns which anticipate the eternals rewards of heaven: "Jerusalem, my happy home" "Land of Rest", anonymous early American melody
