Pastor's Corner



In this Sunday's Gospel depicting the Transfiguration, Peter, James, and John receive the sneak peek of all sneak peeks. They got a vision of Christ in his glory, a glance at Heaven's splendor, no doubt meant to stay in their memories and propel them toward the final victory that

would await all who persevered in faith to the end. Notice how that vision of Christ in his full glory suddenly made it easy for them to abandon their worldly concerns. We cannot truly imagine what it was like to see what they saw, but we can at least draw analogies. For example, did you ever see a painting or hear a piece of music that suddenly touched you on a level, deep in your soul, you had never experienced?

I felt that way on two different occasions when, as a young person, my parents dragged me to two different church concerts, one of a sacred polyphony choir and the other of a small orchestra that played Johann Sabastian Bach. On each occasion, the second the music started, it triggered a kind of shift in my consciousness, and while the music lasted, something in me was activated that was both so intriguing and felt very tranguil. I imagine that seeing Jesus in his glory was something analogous to that, although infinitely greater. Evidently, what those three apostles saw at the Transfiguration was so sublime that they desired to drop everything on the spot and just gaze at Christ with Moses and Elijah for all of eternity.

The Transfiguration is meant to communicate many profound truths to us, and one is that we would be foolish to cling too tightly to any of the delights we currently possess or desire in this life. There is an indescribable knowledge and joy that awaits, which surpasses anything we could possibly imagine right now. As Saint Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 2:9, "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, and no mind has imagined what God has prepared for those who love him." If and when we receive it, whatever is troubling us now, big or small, will not matter. It will seem like it was a proverbial blip on the screen. We will not be able to suffer any lack because full union with Christ in all of his glory is the fulfillment of all desire. Let's try to be mindful of that whenever we are tempted to turn away from God and settle for anything less.

Fr. Timothy Conlan grew up in San Francisco, where he attended Catholic grammar and high schools. He studied at U.C. Davis and S.F. State College, entered the Dominican Order in 1960, was ordained in 1967, and had his first pastoral ministry in 1970 in Seattle. He served in parishes in San Francisco and Anchorage before coming to Berkeley in 1980 for one year, and then in 1981 began working as the director of Social Justice and Continuing Education for the Dominican Province. After a sabbatical in Peru and Central American in 1986, he served for four years at our parish in Mexicali. In 1991-92 he served in Guatemala, returning to Rabinal there in 1998 until the present.



Music Notes - August 0, 202

Organ music for 7:30 & 11 a.m. masses:

Prelude: "Pavane for a dead princess" by Maurice Ravel, arr. for organ by Dennis Janzer

Pavane for a Dead Princess (Pavane pour une infante défunte) is a well known piano piece by the French composer Maurice Ravel. It was composed in 1899 and published in 1900 and later in orchestrated version in 1910. Ravel <u>described the piece as "an evocation of a</u> <u>pavane that a little princess [Infanta] might, in</u> <u>former times, have danced at the Spanish court</u>. Its prayerful mood invokes a culture of reverence practiced in the Catholic Spanish court for centuries.

Postlude: Prince of Denmark's March by Jeremiah Clarke

The *Prince of Denmark's March*, commonly called the *Trumpet Voluntary*, was written around 1700 by the English composer <u>Jeremiah Clarke</u>, the first organist of the then newly-rebuilt <u>St</u> <u>Paul's Cathedral</u>. Popular as <u>wedding music</u>, the march was played during the <u>wedding of Lady</u> <u>Diana Spencer and Prince Charles</u> at St Paul's Cathedral in 1981.
