Pastor's Corner



Well, last Thursday evening made for another worthwhile exercise in evangelization at our parish's booth in the local farmers market. As many of you know, we have been handing out free rosaries to strangers there and inviting them to St. Dominic's, which sometimes triggers

conversations with them about the Christian faith. You might be surprised at how many people end up being interested in those little plastic rosaries. They also seem to really care about receiving the color they want. I always hang one of each color from my fingers and invite them to choose, which has the added benefit of lengthening the encounter and potentially opening the door to a more in-depth conversation between them and us. Sometimes that longer conversation happens, and other times the person just politely takes the rosary and heads off on his or her way. Regardless, it is always a delightful exchange.

In between those delightful exchanges, however, can be a lot of seeming rejection from many passers-by who are disinterested in what we have to offer. When that happens (and it happens a lot), I always tell myself, "I am so glad my positive self-image is not contingent on whether these people stop or keep walking." I remind myself that I am not supposed to be out there to feed my ego but rather for the good of others. Even when people don't stop, you never know what seeds might have been planted, merely by the offer of that rosary. Sometimes the seed takes sprout very fast indeed. For example, in some cases, I offered people rosaries, which they rejected, but then a few minutes later found that they had returned and were asking if they could have one after all.

Our overall endeavor in the farmers market reminds me of an essential teaching from scripture. In last Monday's daily mass Gospel from Luke, Jesus reminded us that no one conceals a lighted lamp in a vessel or hides it under a bed. The light is put on a lampstand so that others are not left to stumble hopelessly in the dark. Jesus wants us to think of his word and true faith in general as being like that lighted lamp. How often do we think of Christian faith in such terms? Our parish booth in the farmers market is just one of many ways we can treat God and his word as a lighted lamp that is placed on a lampstand. Let us all keep working together to be a means by which Our Lord's light can lead our neighbors home to his loving embrace.

Meditation (Communion) by the French composer and organist Jean Langlais is based on a chant Ubi Caritas, and is part of the cycle of liturgical organ pieces "Suite Medievale". Even though Langlais was blind, he was appointed organist at St. Clotilde Basilica in Paris, following in the footsteps of the great Cesar Franck.
