Pastor's Corner



Last Sunday, Father Gregory gave a wonderful homily about forgiveness. He rightly pointed out that forgiving others can be seriously difficult, depending on how others have hurt us. One insight I often find helpful is that forgiveness is not just about the good of the one who has wronged us.

We need to forgive others for our own good because withholding that forgiveness is toxic for our souls. In many cases, when we withhold forgiveness, as a result, we suffer far more than the person we refuse to forgive. That lack of forgiveness typically takes the form of long-standing resentment. In regard to lengthy resentment, there is a helpful famous expression: "Resentment is like drinking poison and hoping the other guy dies." The saying is pointing out that when we cling to and nurse negative feelings toward others, very often those we resent are all the while off busy living their lives, unaffected by those negative feelings we are inflicting on ourselves. Again, unforgiveness often only hurts those who are withholding the forgiveness. Of course, the most important problem with unforgiveness is that it runs counter to the example set by Jesus Christ. Jesus loved humanity with a love more powerful than humanity's wickedness. The Christian command to forgive is a call to love others with that supernatural love by way of the Holy Spirit dwelling within our hearts, making us into powerful weapons against Satan's ability to sow malice. Keep in mind, however, loving others in the way Christ loves sinners does not necessarily mean sharing a mutual affability with them. I learned this years ago from someone guite familiar to many of you. During the spring of 2012, I visited this parish with my novice class to give my vocation story, and I remember the then pastor Father Michael Hurley making a helpful remark in regard to Christ's love and forgiveness. "When the Romans were nailing Jesus to the cross and Jesus asked the Father to forgive them, Jesus was loving those Romans, but that didn't mean he was having warm feelings about them. They probably weren't going to be spending Thanksgiving together," he quipped. Loving others as Christ loved us is less about liking the people who hurt us and more about willing their good in the form of willing that they obtain God. In many cases that requires us to pray for them to repent of whatever sins that may be keeping them from accepting the mercy God is offering them. Now, living those Christian principles is much more difficult than just talking about them. If we embrace that difficulty with the help of God's grace, the toil is sure to purify us of our own sinfulness. It will also shape us into people who are more fit for the happiness that Christ's forgiveness made possible for all who persevere in faith to the end.





Organ music for 7:30 and 11 a.m. Masses

Prelude: Adagio from organ concerto # 2 by J. S. Bach Bach composed his organ concertos during his Weimar period, when he was an organist at the court of the Duke of Weimar. At that time, he became familiar and influenced by the music of Vivaldi. In fact, many believe that his organ concertos are arrangements of Vivaldi violin concertos.

Postlude: With Trumpets and Horns from "Water Music" by G. F. Handel

The *Water Music* is a collection of orchestral movements, often published as three <u>suites</u>, composed by <u>George Frideric Handel</u>. It premiered on 17 July 1717, in response to <u>King George I</u>'s request for a concert on the <u>River Thames</u>.


