Pastor's Corner



This past Thursday was All Souls Day, a day on which we remember to pray for our beloved dead. While many of us may prefer the joyful festivities of All Saints Day, All Souls Day offers its own special rewards. One of those rewards is the freedom that can come from meditating on the reality of death.

Remembering the fact that one day I will die frequently serves as a quick and easy way to regain proper focus when my mind and heart get bogged down by stress or envy. In regard to stress, it is easy for all of us to become overwhelmed by responsibilities and the steep expectations others have of us. As for envy, when we see peers who are smarter, possess more material wealth, or have a seemingly better physical appearance, it is easy to stay sad from an inferiority complex. The profundity of death, however, has the power to reorient our concerns in quite an efficient way. As a priest, I see so many coffins go into the ground, and the sight of each one helps me to keep my priorities grounded. If you are not a religious minister who presides over a lot of funerals, however, it's easy to go long stretches of time without thinking about death. Obviously, there are numerous reasons many of us might avoid contemplating the grave, but one reason pertains to what we, as a society, consider what it means for a person to be in his or her "prime." As our looks fade and our physical endurance and mobility diminish, we usually think of that as "getting past our prime," and in worldly terms, perhaps that is somewhat true. But for those of us who persevere in faith to the end, our true prime – our everlasting prime – is something that awaits us.

During this life, with the help of God's grace, we can develop ever closer to that spiritual prime. Have you ever met an elderly person who really seemed to be in his or her spiritual prime? My first year as a Dominican. I felt that way about a now-deceased priest from the Western Dominican Province named Father Felix Cassidy. Near the end of his life, when I saw photos of him, his face appeared quite decrepit. But when I saw him in person, his inner sanctity and joy made him seem so much younger. Others expressed the same observation about him to me. It is fun to be in our physical prime, but that prime is ephemeral. If we stay focused on growing into our everlasting spiritual prime, the stresses and temptations to envy in this life will lose their power. Contemplating death is a helpful way of maintaining that focus.


