Pastor's Corner



Well, another annual Catholic Schools Week is upon us, and I have been looking forward to it! I love being pastor of St. Dominic's School. I just really dig everyone I know associated with our educational institution – the students, parents, teachers, administrative staff, and our incredible principal, Penny Ogden. They all make the school feel

like an oasis from so many of the toxic elements in our nation's wider culture. Most importantly, the Catholic Faith is at the heart of our philosophy of education, and the teachers and principal are always open to working with Father Gregory, Brother Anselm, and me to continually build up the school's Catholic identity. We Dominican brothers are having fun working with the school toward that ongoing goal. The other brothers and I each have different approaches to engaging the kids with our Catholic faith, but a major emphasis for me is to encourage the students to think of their faith as something that should be integrated into all aspects of their lives. My hope is our students will become young men and women who do not compartmentalize their faith. Compartmentalizing our faith has multiple bad effects on our spiritual lives. One negative effect of it is that it can cause us to have one persona on Sundays and a radically different one the other six days of the week. This can lead us to live our lives with dual, sometimes utterly contrary, mindsets, which is bound to keep us stunted, spiritually. A second drawback to compartmentalizing our faith is that very often by doing so, we set ourselves up to find our faith boring. This can happen especially with kids. It certainly did for me when I was a youngster. I tended to compartmentalize my faith by treating God sort of the way I treated vegetables at dinner. As a child, I knew I needed to eat the vegetables for my physical health, but I would eat them with the aim of just 'getting them out of the way' before enjoying everything else on my plate. There is, of course, nothing wrong with eating this way, but we do not want to have the same mentality toward God – a mentality of just getting him out of the way on Sundays. We should want to carry our Christian identity into everything we do, both the serious and the lighter stuff. This is one reason I like to wear my Niners hat with my habit around town. My faith is relevant when I am chanting, solemnly, the Divine Office in the morning with the other brothers, and it is also relevant when I am just being a gung-ho sports fan walking down 1st Street. Teaching full integration of our faith is the primary reason I like to bless our school's athletes before their games – that and the fact that watching them play is a blast! At our school we teach there are times to be serious, other times to just have fun, and our faith is relevant to every minute of our lives!





Organ music for 7:30 and 11:00 a.m. Masses: Prelude: "Over the Stars There is Rest" by Franz Abt

This piece by German composer Abt reminds us of our heavenly home and alludes to Apostles as they watched Jesus' Ascension to heaven

Postlude: Prelude in C major by J. S. Bach BWV 553

"Bach's Eight Short Preludes and Fugues bwv553–60 have also been attributed to both Tobias and Ludwig [Krebs]; on stylistic grounds neither seems likely." (Hugh J. McLean. "Krebs." In Grove Music Online. Oxford Music Online). While some claim Bach did not compose this work, it is one of his most popular organ pieces

Choral Communion meditation for 11:00 a.m. Mass: He Shall feed His flock from Messiah by Handel

This is a movement from Handel's popular oratorio "Messiah". It is interesting to recall that Handel wrote Messiah, his most famous work whilst at the lowest point of his career, suffering from financial hardship and depression. It was only composing that distracted him from this misery. In He Shall Feed His Flock, based on texts of Isaiah and Matthew, we hear praise for the peace that the Messiah has brought to earth.
