Pastor's Corner



In a daily mass reading from the Gospel of Luke this past week, Jesus admonishes his hearers to be merciful, which he indicates will help them to be less judgmental, more forgiving, and more generous. It makes sense, given the nature of true Christian mercy. Saint Thomas Aquinas describes mercy as a kind of sharing in the

misery of another's plight. Of course, it is important to make the right distinction about what it means to share in another's misery in a way that is merciful. To be truly merciful means avoiding two different extremes. As one extreme, if we are not careful, we can claim to have compassion for another's difficult plight in a way that is patronizing, that has a selfcongratulatory air of coming from on high. This is an attitude that is too distant from feeling the misery of another in a way that is fruitful for both us and them. And it can lead us to have a vain saviorcomplex, which is not what Jesus calls us to when preaching the importance of mercy. Rather, when striving to be merciful, we should cultivate a sense of solidarity with those who suffer as part of a capacity to regard the good of others as our own good. We should remind ourselves that their plights could easily be our own, but for the grace of God. Now, while it is good, in a certain sense, to be able to know the misery of others, it is not good to fall into despair as a result. Sometimes, people allow themselves to become overwhelmed by all of the suffering in the world in a way that is quite counterproductive. They fill their time reading news sites, blogs, and watching YouTube videos about all of the world's ills, but all they do in response is bemoan the problems to themselves and to anyone else who will listen.

Lent is a great time for getting off of that hamster-wheel through the three basic pillars of the season – prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. If we do those three things with faithful hearts, we can know we will be taking helpful action toward fighting the world's evils. A right understanding of mercy was key to Our Lord's willingness to take our sinful nature to himself and atone for our sins on the cross. He was willing to have solidarity with our suffering, not in a way that overwhelmed him, but in a way that propelled him to defeat the consequences of our sins and win our Salvation.







Adult Confirmation Spring 2024

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who are baptized, have received First Communion, and have received religious instruction since their First Communion, but for various reasons were never received the Sacrament of Confirmation.



The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for Saturday, May 18, 2024, at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, Sacramento, 5:00 p.m. Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing 8 sessions held over a series of consecutive Sundays from March 10, 2024 through May 5, 2024, 3:00-4:30 p.m., St. Dominic's Ministry Center, Siena Rm.

Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, and have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate certified within the past 6 months. Confirmation candidates must select a Sponsor who must be Catholic, received the Sacrament of Confirmation, is a

practicing Catholic, and is at least 16 years of

Prelude: Chorale 1 by Cesar Franck (excerpt)
César Franck (1822-1890) stands as a
cornerstone of the French organ tradition.
Born in Belgium, he became the Organiste
Titulaire at the Basilica of St. Clotilde in Paris.
Written in the last year of his life, his Three
Chorals for organ represent a mastering of
motivic development.
Organ Postlude: Toccata in G minor by
Johann Pachelbel
Johann Pachelbel (1653 – 1706) was a
German composer, organist, and teacher who
brought the south German organ schools to
their peak. He composed a large body of
sacred and secular music, and his
contributions to the development of
the chorale prelude and fugue (variations on
chant melodies) have earned him a place
among the most important composers of the
middle Baroque era.
